CURRICULUM

Learning in Reception!

The Reception children have been playing with clay both inside and outside. They have explored this natural material, moulding, shaping and modelling with it. Many have just enjoyed the feeling of it in their hands, especially when water is added! Next we will add different tools to imprint marks and create textures. Such fun!

Having learned about Diwali, the Hindu celebration of light, the children made diva lamps with clay, first moulding the clay with their thumbs and then decorating them with colour and sparkles.









Sycamore enjoyed listening to one of their parents tell a story that Hindus celebrate, of Rama and his victory over the bad demon king Ravanna. Of course, good always wins over bad!

Learning in Year 3!

Year 3 have had a hands-on and productive start to the Autumn half term, practicing a variety of important skills. In science, they've been exploring measurement techniques using tape measures, while also focusing on ensuring their tests are fair and accurate. Over in sewing, the children have been learning to thread needles, tie secure knots, and perfect their running stitches. These skills are all in preparation for creating their very own Christmas stockings. Throughout these activities, the children have demonstrated fantastic resilience and enthusiasm, embracing every challenge with determination and enjoyment!







We also had a visit from Dr Mandy Hartley who wrote the DNA Detective series of books. The children took on the role of archaeologists and scientists working on ancient DNA.

We 'excavated' an 'ancient grave' and using artefacts, their skeleton and DNA worked out whether the person found was a Neanderthal or Homo Sapien, how they died, what their job might have been, what status they were likely to have had and whether they were male or female.

We used DNA sequences to find out what the person would have looked like including their skin, hair and eye colour. We found out about the Cheddar Man where this was done in real life!

Dr Hartley was very impressed with the children's knowledge about the Stone Age and enthusiasm for investigating who the person was!


AUTHOR & SCIENTIST EVENT






A couple of days ago, a scientist - called Dr Mandy Hartly - came to our school. She explained to us the opportunities of her job and how it inspired her to become an author; her dreams came true. Book after book was published, and now she has written her fourth book. Her books are based on her experience with science and daily life. Her children have had a big impact on her story writing career as they are both main characters in her books. She has convinced many of our peers to become either an author, a scientist or even both! It has had a great impact on our lives. We were influenced by her explanations and brilliant ideas. Overall, her trip to Woodside was very successful and we hope that she has inspired many people.

Working memory

Research shows that we can increase the capacity of working memory up until the age of 14! There are lots of things you can do to support your child's working memory at home.

- Playing memory games e.g. naming the objects hidden under a blanket
- Matching games
- Play card games e.g. Uno or go fish! Children will have to remember the rules as they play
- Give 2 part instructions when drawing or colouring, gradually increasing them. E.g. colour the house blue and the windows pink.
